The one door into the ark pictures Christ as the one door into salvation

As Isaac was a "promised son," so Jesus Christ is also a "Promised Son."

The offering of Isaac pictures God's willingness to do the same.

Joseph saved his family from destruction as Jesus has also saved His family from sin.

Moses—left the comforts of the Egyptian palace to dwell among his brethren, just as Jesus left heaven

Moses—Led the people out of the bondage of slavery, just as Jesus leads us out of the bondage of sin

The Passover Lamb is a picture of the ultimate sacrifice of the perfect lamb. Christ to save us

Numerous Tabernacle parallels to Christ: The high priest, the sacrifices on the altar, the one gate into the courtyard, the colors of the curtain (blue, red, white, purple). Moses—bringer of the law; Christ, bringer of a new law. Joshua—Led the people into the Promised Land; Christ leads His people into the Promised Land. Bronze Serpent, Scapegoat, manna

Judah

Each judge is a savior and a ruler, a spiritual and political deliverer. Thus, the judges portray the role of Christ as the Savior-King of His people. Some of the judges were warrior-rulers, one was a priest, and two were prophets. This gives a cumulative picture of the 3 offices of Christ, who excelled all His predecessors—the ultimate Prophet/Priest/King. Boaz and Ruth's leviratic marriage also portray the work of Christ.

Samuel is a type of Christ in that he is a prophet, priest and judge. David is one of the primary OT portrayals of the person of Christ. He is the anointed king who becomes the forerunner of the messianic King. Through his seed, the Christ will be born. Solomon's kingdom foreshadows Christ's kingdom.

God preserves the one continuous Davidic dynasty so that He can remain faithful to the His covenant with David and bring in Christ as David's descendant.

While Elijah reminds us of the work of John the Baptist, Elisha reminds us of Christ as he lived among the people and emphasized grace, life and hope.

Daniel's prophecies predict that Christ is the Great Stone who will crush the kingdoms of this world, the Son of Man who is given dominion by the Ancient of Days and the coming Messiah who will be cut off.

The Messiah's coming is pinpointed in the Vision of the 69 weeks.



Zerubbabel is called the "Signet Ring" and is part of the messianic line who seals the 2 messianic lines together.

Esther Portrays Christ in her salvation of her people
Nehemiah portrays Christ in his ministry of restoration and illustrates Christ's life by giving up a high position to identify with the plight of his people.

MATTHEW—Jesus is Israel's promised Messianic King

MARK—Jesus is our Servant and Savior; compassionate, active and obedient
